GGLC Membership Payments

Response to the Chairman's AGM Speech

Our Chairman's Speech was, as usual generally well received by the members. However, as he himself said, there was a specific section that I personally find contentious. This is, as most will realise from previous posts of mine, the views on the Trans community.

The idea that we can not find commonality with them, especially those who do not see themselves as gay, bi or lesbian. In my view, that commonality is in the reaction of the wider public to them. It is the same reaction we are more than familiar with, though it is not as strong as 20 or 30 years ago.

The language used against the Trans community is the same, often word for word, as has been used against the rest of us. This is more than enough reason to stand with them.

On the idea of standing with the Trans community, I would like to remind the membership that there were there in force at the very beginning of the Stonewall Riots and the beginning of all our liberation.

I will note the change we are seeing in the USA. Two years ago, they were assuring the LGB communities that the action against the Trans was limited and not intended to attack us. Now, emboldened, we see their remits expanding, in some cases calling for our eradication. What happens in the US, we will see here in a year or two, though there is evidence this resurgence of wanting our elimination is here already.

An indicator of how much this has already started is the statistic showing hate crime reporting has increased 124% for this past year. Some of this may be due to better reporting systems, but we must all be aware of the increase of extremist voices on traditional media, social media and in our streets.

Various vocal groups (including some stating they support 'parts' of our community) are attempting to split us apart, with the obvious long term intention of removing us in small bites. I see this on social media, in the press and in the attitudes of various political groups. A certain football pundit recently linked the language someone was using with that used by the parties of 1930s Germany. That type of political tactics are also clearly being used against our communities, and we should be aware and open when we see this being done.

My view has always been 'United we stand, divided we fall', and I see no reason to change that view.

GLOUCESTERSHIRE GAY AND LESBIAN COMMUNITY GROUP CHAIRMAN'S SPEECH

Dear Colleagues on the Management Committee, fellow members and friends of the Group

It is with greatest pleasure that I address you again as your Chairman, this time for our 49th Annual General Meeting

Many other groups around the country are struggling or have folded – for example, other Gay Groups, Railway enthusiast clubs and even Cubs and Scouts. It is marvellous that we not only survived but have thrived. Thanks is due to the Committee, particularly, Rob, Craig and Graham who organized our electronic meetings. 'On-line' is an integral part of how the Group runs and they fit in perfectly with those who cannot attend physically on our regular nights.

The Group continues to expand and always facing new changes in LGBT + Lives. 'Trans' is a current issue and bringing debate to all sections of Society. I have been brought to task for comments made in our Newsletter, but sometimes you have to act an "agent provocateur" just to get people thinking and to educate. I personally do not agree that 'Trans' was added to the already lengthy "LGBTQ" etc and our flag. One label but no consultation. I do not feel any commonality with the "trans" community. That does not mean many in the community are not my friends or that I am not here to support their cause. If "Trans" do not identify as LG or B either, is the campaign going down the right road? Interesting point to discuss.

The complaint of all those organizing a group is that everyone wants everything done for them. It is not easy – we hope we have overcome some of these difficulties with a new contact list, started by a newer member, Navi. It seems to be since COVID that people will not commit to helping. What if the Chair/Committee decided not to bother turning up, unlocking the doors – the Group would not last long.

A big change to our organisation is Immigration and Asylum and so many young people arriving in the country, needing help from the persecution they have lived under. Those who managed to arrive here safely now have to live within restrictions and cannot work. So many young people have no funds in which to take part in social life and attend our regular meetings. A lot of help and advice is offered by Gay Glos and we wanted to make our own contribution. We could not offer 'free' membership and facilities – there are other men and women who cannot afford to join us so we wanted to handle this as delicately as possible. The Committee decided to offer Gayglos a grant i.e.a sum of which is not repayable.

They are the link to the Asylum community and in the best place to help in the most positive way. The only stipulation is the money is to be used for Immigration and asylum men and women. This only started recently and seems to be working well.

We hope to organize more group events during 2023, trip to Worcester to Sugar Daddies and Sunday Lunch at Fairview will be arranged – how about a visit to the new Abba Concert?

The past 12 months have yet again been quite eventful for the group and gay life in the County. Our Vice Chair is currently The Mayor of Gloucester – Congratulations Howard. Members are supporting Prides around the County.

The loss of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second impacted around the world. For most of us she is the only Monarch we have known. We wish our new King and Queen a happy reign. The new Queen organized "Coronation Champions" – an award especially for outstanding achievement in volunteer work within the community. I am delighted to tell you I was one of the 5000+ whose name was proposed and one of the 500 winners! Today a lovely certificate arrived signed personally by the King and the Queen, a limited edition medal pin and invitation to a private garden party on the 9th May. I am thrilled and very excited to be honoured in this way. I am sure my dedication to the GGLC played a part in that.

We move into our 50th year in 2024 and an achievement we must celebrate.

Thank you to the current Management committee – Peter, our long standing and very excellent Secretary, Howard our esteemed Vice Chair, Craig our Treasurer who is stepping down this year, Sergio our Membership Secretary who replaced Rob last year. Rob was recognised at our last Annual Dinner with the title "emeritus" and remains as a Committee Member, Peter S, Committee Member and of course Graham our most prestigious Newsletter Editor. They keep the Group running on our behalf and please show your thanks.

As a gay community we have excelled ourselves, still here after nearly 50 years, offering a safe meeting place for LGBT people from around the world,

I wish each and every one of you the best during the Reign of our new King and Queen and hope that we will continue to survive and grow.


